

Port of Tyne – Schedule of Charges 2022: Comprehensive Review

Stakeholder Consultation

As a Statutory and Competent Harbour Authority, we are required to review our Schedule of Charges on an annual basis.

Having taken into account feedback from our stakeholders, we have undertaken a comprehensive review of the structure and charges for 2022. Our main objective is to simplify and consolidate our Schedule of Charges, in addition to our usual annual review of the level of charges.

This review has now been completed and we would now like to engage with our stakeholders to share the proposed tariff and allow stakeholders to share feedback on the proposal which we urge is done at the earliest stage of the process.

Due to the restructuring and simplification a number of charges have been renamed and / or consolidated.

The purpose of this consultation is to ensure you are aware of the proposed changes to the charges which (subject to any amendments as a result of consultation feedback) will be implemented on 1 January 2022.
